BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS:	
Claimant, Vevlon Days-Kimmons of 240 for reimbursement in the amount of \$501.75 for	05 Romayne Avenue, Racine, Wisconsin, filed this claim damages allegedly arising when her vehicle sideswiped a was encroaching onto the westbound traffic lane on Spring I Ohio Streets, on or about October 4, 2017

2017 meeting. At that meeting, Alderman Perez questioned whether this block of Spring Street was within the municipal boundaries of the City of Racine. The Committee voted to defer this item to allow the City Attorney's Office to investigate whether the location of this alleged accident was within City limits.

This claim was first brought before the Finance and Personnel Committee during its November 27,

Alderman Perez was correct in his belief that this portion of Spring Street is not located within the municipal boundaries of the City of Racine, as evidenced by the attached map. In fact, the block in question,

the 4600 block of Spring Street, and several other contiguous blocks of Spring Street to both the east and west are located within the Village of Mt. Pleasant.

Furthermore, the City Attorney's Office subsequently received confirmation from the City's Solid Waste Division that the City does not collect any solid waste or recycling along the portion of Spring Street located between Meadowbrook Avenue and Green Bay Road.

As such, the City of Racine is not liable for the damages claimed because the alleged accident that is the basis of Ms. Days-Kimmons' claim occurred in the Village of Mt. Pleasant and any residential garbage containers involved in this alleged accident would not have belonged to City of Racine residents nor been serviced by City DPW employees.

Inasmuch as the alleged location of this claim falls outside the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Racine, City Attorney's Office respectfully recommends that this Committee deny Ms. Days-Kimmons' claim because it was improperly filed against the wrong municipality.

BUDGETARY IMPACT:

Assuming the recommendation to deny this claim is adopted, this item would have a \$0.00 impact on the City's budget.

OPTIONS/ALTERNATIVES:

If the recommendation to deny this claim is rejected, and the Committee recommends that this claim be paid by the City (contrary to any indication of the City's liability for this alleged accident), this item would have up to a \$501.75 impact on the City's 2017 claims budget.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

The City Attorney's Office respectfully recommends that this Committee deny this claim because it was improperly filed against the wrong municipality.
