operation issues with the signal timing of that intersection. He was particularly concerned of a through movement queue that would be long enough as to prevent cars from entering into the left-turn lane.

After explaining the analysis, he showed the Commission that essentially 95% of all vehicles in that outmost right through lane turn right to go southbound to westbound on W. 6th Street. He noted, in effect, the outside southbound lane was acting as a de facto right-turn lane already. He did acknowledge that south of the intersection the outside lane does drop off, but only 5% of vehicles in that outside lane go through the intersection. They are either going into the gas station or they simply merge into traffic southbound, south of the intersection. He noted the options for the Traffic Commission were to mark the outside lane as right-turn lane only and put up the appropriate signs or leave the intersection as is, as it is already functioning in that manner. He did ask the Traffic Commission to consider, if approving the change, to not implement the change until 2018 when S. Memorial Drive is resurfaced with a road project that will go from the Memorial Drive Bridge all the way up to Liberty Street. He further noted, that if it was approved and they wanted to make the changes in the field now, it would be temporary and only last a few months until next year's construction when it would be removed. He also noted it may be confusing to motorists who think it was part of a temporary detour for the Memorial Bridge Street Project.

After further discussion, a motion was made by Mozol, seconded by Weidner to receive and file. Passed unanimously.

Secretary Rooney explained the traffic study to the Traffic Commission for the request of a 4-way stop at the intersection of Carlisle Avenue and Goold Street. He noted that the majority of the traffic through that intersection is on Goold Street. He noted approximately 7,200 vehicles a day travel east and west while Carlisle Avenue has less than 600 vehicles going through the intersection from the north and south approaches. He also noted they looked at if there were any issues with vision triangle problems on the four quadrants of the intersection and noted there were none. He noted that the study included pedestrian factors such as dismissal and distance from Horlick High School, Wadowitz Elementary School and Gilmore Middle School. He noted pedestrians were counted in late May when the weather was very conducive to walking. He noted during the peak hours for pedestrians, which was after Horlick High School dismissal, approximately 60 pedestrians used the intersection to cross. He noted of those pedestrians, all were teenagers or adults and he noted of those pedestrians that crossed that intersection, only six crossed Goold Street, the rest crossed Carlisle. He also noted during the same time increment, 150 vehicles passed through Goold Street while only 10 crossed Carlisle. He also noted there was an accident study for the last 5+ years and noted there have been a few accidents at this location; however, none of the accidents were correctable by installing a different or higher form of traffic control. They were all driver error. He recommended the traffic control remain as is, and requested this item be received and filed.

Diane Talamentez asked the Traffic Commission to reconsider. She noted there was a recent accident at the intersection this month and believed that the number of students crossing the intersection was low due to being late in the school year.

Alderman DeHahn spoke about the traffic conditions on Goold Street and also referred to the intersection near Mt. Pleasant Street, which is very difficult to get onto from Goold Street.

Alderwoman Weidner made a recommendation to approve a 4-way stop at the intersection, but for lack of a second, the motion died.

A motion was made by Yehlen, seconded by Mozol to receive and file. On a roll all vote, members voting aye: Mozol, Yehlen, Tran
