Location: 1700 N. Main Street, located on the northwest corner of the intersection of N. Main Street and High Street.

Applicant: Belle City Church

Property Owner: NORTHWINDS DEVELOPMENT LLC

Request: Consideration of a conditional use permit to operate a religious institution, classified as a Class 1 non-commercial-type use, in an existing building at 1700 N. Main Street for property located in a B-2 Community Shopping Zone District as required in section <u>114-468</u>* of the Municipal Code.


*Note 114-468 refers back to 114-448 where Class 1 non-commercial-type use is listed.

BACKGROUND AND SUMMARY: The applicant seeks to utilize the existing building at 1700 N. Main Street to provide a religious institution, classified as a Class 1 non-commercial type use on the ground floor. The applicant has proposed worship on Sundays with the institution being open from 7:00 AM to 1:00 PM and general office hours for the facility would be from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday – Friday There are small groups who would use the facility during the evening. The church would also offer marriage and individual counseling ministries from this location by appointment throughout the week.

The Zoning Ordinance classifies this proposed religious institution as a Class 1 non-commercial-type use, defined in Section 114-1, as permissible in the B-2 Community Shopping Zone District upon the issuance of a conditional use permit (114-468).

Consistency with Adopted Plans:

The Racine Comprehensive Plan states that:

- The plan should encourage the redevelopment of older areas and commercial areas.
- Maintain and develop a land use pattern that strengthens the character and livability of the City's downtown core, commercial and industrial areas, and neighborhoods.
- Encourage development patterns that promote efficient and sustainable use of land, that can be readily linked by transportation systems and that utilize existing public utilities and services.
- Promote redevelopment and infill in areas with existing infrastructure and services, enhancing existing residential, commercial, and industrial areas.
- Promote the expansion or stabilization of the current economic base and the creation of a range of employment opportunities.

Current Zoning District: B-2 Community Shopping

Purpose of Zone District: The B-2 community shopping district is intended to accommodate the needs of a much larger consumer population than is served by the neighborhood convenience district, thus a wider range of uses and structure sizes is permitted for both daily and occasional shopping.

Proposed Zoning: No change proposed

Existing Land Use: Currently vacant building, last known use was a music store.

Surrounding Zoning and Land Uses:

Operations: The applicant has proposed worship on Sundays with the institution being open from 7:00 AM to 1:00 PM and general office hours for the facility would be from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday – Friday. There are small groups who would use the facility during the evening on occasion. The church would also offer marriage and individual counseling ministries from this location by throughout the weekday operating hours or by appointment.

ANALYSIS:

Development Standards:

Density (<u>114-Article V</u>: Article VII, Div. 5 <u>Bulk Regulations</u> & 8 <u>Lots</u>): There are no changes planned to the exterior of the building as a result of this proposal.

*Note: Section 114-470 (b) requires buildings and structures in the B-2 district to be 100 feet away from a residence district boundary line if not screened. As such, the northern lot line is not required to have a transitional yard. Screening is required however, and is discussed later on in this report.

Building design standards (114-Secs. 735.5 & 736): The building on the parcel complies with the requirements of 114.735.5.b.1, however this request does not include any new buildings or modifications to the existing building. The northern and western exterior walls do need some touch up paint where it has worn off or been damaged.

Off-street parking and loading requirements (114- <u>Article XI</u>) :

A Building of this size does not require a dedicated loading space; the drive aisle around the building fulfills this requirement.

*Note: the site plan shows 19 spaces, however having both space 18 and 19 would not allow for the required maneuvering space, one would need to be eliminated. The office is for the religious institution and as such, is not likely to create use conflicts with the spaces required for the main use on the property.

Landscaping, screening and yard requirements (<u>114- Article V</u>: Article VII, Div. 6 <u>Development Standards</u> & 7 <u>Fences and Walls</u>): 114-734 (a) requires screening along the north property line and a portion of the western boundary to the north or the site, because the adjacent lots are residentially zoned. The screening along the western portion of the property to the north fulfills this requirement. The screening along the northern property line may be a wall, fence, or densely planted compact hedge, not less than five feet nor more than eight feet in height. There is currently a chain link style fence along the parking areas by the street frontage. It is in disrepair and as a condition of this approval, it needs to be removed.

Sign Regulations (114-<u>Article X</u>): Signage is not a part of this request. Any future signage would need to follow the sizing requirements outlined below.

*Total size determination would be made based on sizes and types of other signage on the lot. Once 4 or more signs are installed, the total is reduced by 20% with each subsequent sign.

^Each building is allowed two (2) window signs under four (4) square feet in total size, which do not count against the total allowable signage.

Outdoor lighting, signs (<u>114-Sec. 742</u>): Two exterior lights exist on the west side on the building. It appears the fixtures focus light onto the property and would comply with the development requirements. The plans submitted by the applicant do not include additional lighting fixtures.

Rubbish and trash storage (<u>114-Article V</u> & <u>114-740</u>): A trash enclosure is not depicted on the site plan, prior to occupying the building one will need to be constructed. Regardless of the action taken by the Plan Commission, the enclosure is required when the building becomes occupied. It will be included as a condition of approval. To enhance the pedestrian experience, the condition is requiring the enclosure be located away from the sidewalk.

Engineering, Utilities and Access:

Access $(\underline{114}-\underline{1151})$: Vehicular access to the site is provided from driveways off N. Main Street and High Street. The site plan submitted by the applicant does not contemplate any changes to access.

Surface drainage (114-739 & Consult Engineering Dept.): A tenant occupying the building is not expected to impact the surface drainage of this lot.

Sewage disposal and water supply (<u>114-821</u> & Consult Engineering and S/W Utility): All utilities are available for this site and the applicant proposal is not expected to impact the ability to serve this area.

Exceptions to ordinance: No exceptions are required for this proposal.

Additional Planning and Zoning Comments:

REQUIRED FINDINGS OF FACT:

CONDITIONAL USE FINDINGS (Sec. 114-154. – Standards.)

No Conditional Use shall be recommended by the Plan Commission unless it is found that:

1) The establishment, maintenance, or operation of the conditional use will not be detrimental to, or endanger, the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare.

Staff Comments: The establishment of a religious institution is not expected to be a detriment to the public safety, health or general welfare of the area or community in general. This type of facility, with the recommended conditions, could be an asset to the area and those living in the neighborhood. This location is easily accessible to the surrounding area and is expected to be an enhancement to the neighborhood, not a detriment.

2) The conditional use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood.

Staff Comments: This conditional use is not anticipated to be injurious to other properties in the general area, assuming the recommended conditions are adopted with this request. The recommended conditions ensure this property will not impair property values or the enjoyment of adjacent properties. There is not expected to be any adverse impacts as a result of reusing this building in the manner proposed by the applicant; the use is not expected to generate loud noise and is anticipated to fit into the generally residential character of the area.

3) The establishment of the conditional use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property for uses permitted in the district.

Staff Comments: The proposed conditions with this request help to ensure that development in the area remains consistent and orderly, while accommodating for new land uses. The recommended conditions also ensure that the property is used more like that of an office type use (which is permitted in this zone) with regular hours to the appearance of a commercial operation is maintained. Business districts are intended for commerce and more active uses; the hours of operation in conjunction with the services being offered by this religious institution will meet the intent of the ordinance, which is that non- commercial type uses function as close to commercial development as possible.

4) Adequate utilities, access roads, drainage and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided.

Staff Comments: The site plan submitted by the applicant does not propose any changes to the access, utilities or drainage for the site. The use of this site and existing building is not expected to impact the provision of utilities for the property or general area.

5) Adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress and egress so designated as to minimize traffic congestion in the public streets.

Staff Comments: The applicant is not contemplating any changes to the access to this site. The nature of this operation is to provide a place of worship and counseling with office hours to run the operation. The ingress and egress from the site is expected to be appropriate to handle this demand. The site has all the required parking given the combination of uses on the site and on-street parking is available to handle excess spaces. The worship services are intended to occur during non-peak traffic times, so in the event the lot becomes full it should be expected that on-street parking would be available.

6) The proposed conditional use is not contrary to the objectives of the current land use plan for the city.

Staff Comments: The land use plan for the City identifies this property as Commercial. This proposed usage is consistent with the objectives of the comprehensive plan and is of a lesser intensity than other uses allowed in this zone district. If the property is utilized as proposed and maintains office hours, occasional evening activities and services on Sunday, it will be generally as active as a lower intensity commercial area. Additionally, this property is adjacent to residential properties and the proposed use helps to provide a buffer and serves as a transition between more intensive development and the residential areas to the north and west.

7) The conditional use shall, in all other respects, conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except as such regulations may, in each instance, be modified pursuant to the recommendations of the plan commission.

Staff Comments: With the recommended conditions, it is expected that this development will operate in accordance with the applicable regulations for this zone district. No exceptions are needed with the request and the proposed development should serve as a buffer to the adjacent residential areas expanding outward from this business node at the intersection of N. Main and High Street.

POSSIBLE ACTIONS FOR THE PLANNING COMMISSION

- 1. Approve the request as submitted; or
- 2. Approve the request with conditions deemed necessary to mitigate any adverse impacts that could arise from the project; or
- 3. Deny the request; or
- 4. Defer the request to obtain more specific information about the request.

STAFF SUPPORTS THE APPLICATION FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- If developed as recommended in the conditions from this report, the site will function in a manner which can be complimentary to the neighborhood.
- The proposed institution will help to provide a mix of uses within walking distance of a predominately residential area, and at a scale and intensity which is complimentary to the neighborhood.
- The property will help to serve as a transitional buffer between more intense and less intensive land uses.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: BASED ON THE FINDINGS OF FACT IN THIS REPORT, THAT THE REQUEST FROM BELLE CITY CHURCH, SEEKING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT TO ALLOW A TYPE 1 NON-COMMERRIAL-TYPE USE AT 1700 N. MAIN STREET BE APPROVED, SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

- a) That the plans presented to the Plan Commission on June 13, 2018 be approved subject to the conditions contained herein.
- b) That all of the following occur by October 31, 2018:
 - 1. Touch up paint to match the existing color of the walls of the building be applied to the north and west walls of the building.
 - 2. The chain link fencing along the southern and eastern property lines shall be removed. Any replacement fencing along any property line shall not be chain link.
 - 3. Screening along northern property line shall be installed and may consist of a wall, non-chain link type fence, or densely planted compact hedge, not less than five feet nor more than eight feet in height.
 - 4. Submission to and approval by the Department of City Development of plans for the trash storage area which shows that all trash and recycling be kept in closed containers which are completely screened from public view and includes a gate on the trash storage area. The trash enclosure shall be constructed within the area depicted below shown in red:




5. Debris along the western property line be removed and plant materials along the western edge of the property be trimmed and deceased or decaying plant matter be removed.

- c) That if, prior to the issuance of an Occupancy Permit, required site improvements listed in "c" above have not been or cannot be completed, a financial surety shall be provided to the City. The surety shall be in a format as approved by the City Attorney's office, and subject to all stipulations as identified for financial sureties in the City of Racine. The dollar amount shall be determined at the time of application based upon estimates provided by the applicants for any incomplete work, and shall be valid for no less than one (1) year from the date of issuance. The surety format and content is subject to review and approval by the City Attorney.
- d) That hours of operation are Sundays from 7:00 AM to 1:00 PM and 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday Friday.
- e) That all codes and ordinances are complied with and required permits acquired.
- f) That no minor changes be made from the conditions of this permit without approval of the Plan Commission, and no major changes be made from the conditions of this permit without the approval of the Common council.
- g) That this conditional use permit is subject to Plan Commission review for compliance with the listed conditions.











