Parks

Parks Division

- Closed down North Beach for the season
- Two staff members spent one full work day on graffiti removal in various Parks
- 42 hours spent removing bushes from Graceland Cemetery
- 232 hours spent removing tree stumps around streets and in Parks
- Completed set up and clean up for Party on the Pavement
- Began wood chipping of the Johnson Dog Park on Hwy 38. This will take a few weeks to complete using 5 staff members each day.
- Spent a few days cleaning out Park Service yard preparing for construction to begin October
- Hired 2 replacement seasonal employees; still down two employees. The new seasonal
 employees do not have CDL licenses which limits their work tasks. There are no CDL people
 applying for City jobs.

Forestry Division

- Approximately 45 inventoried trees and several dozen non-inventoried trees were removed.
- Approximately 607 inventoried trees were pruned.
- Crews responded to approximately 30 reports of branches down or hanging.
- Stump removals and associated parkway restoration are still underway by a contractor.
- EAB-infested street tree removals are still underway by a contractor.
- Bids were solicited for additional stump removal and parkway restoration.
- The forestry mower conducted a significant amount of maintenance mowing at Johnson Park
 work will continue in the vicinity of the disc golf course in a few weeks.
- Ordinance review/revision project: the second meeting was held at which the consultant presented an overview of anticipated ordinance changes.

- Coach Rudy will be hosting youth basketball camps on Saturdays, October 6, 13, 20 and 27.


