10	SUBJECT: Claim of Gabriella Blake, City Attorney File No. 2018-0248

12	EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:
13 14 15 16 17	Gabriella Blake filed a claim with the city requesting \$1,840.00 to compensate for alleged medical costs incurred on or about October 25, 2018, when she tripped while walking through a We Energies construction zone (which the City was not party to) where the sidewalk was removed near the corner of Cleveland and Durand Avenues. The City is not liable for alleged damages that result from construction projects that the City is not party to.
18 19	For this reason, it is the recommendation of the City Attorney's Office that the Finance and Personnel Committee recommend that the Common Council deny this claim.
20	
21	BACKGROUND & ANALYSIS:
22 23 24 25 26 27 28	Gabriella Blake, of 1555 Boyd Avenue in Racine, Wisconsin, filed a claim for reimbursement in the amount of \$1,840.00 for alleged medical costs incurred on or about October 25, 2018, when she tripped while walking through a We Energies construction zone (which the City was not party to) where the sidewalk was removed near the corner of Cleveland and Durand Avenues. Ms. Boyd claims that this alleged hazard was not properly marked and the sidewalk was in a dangerous condition. On the date in question, the sidewalk in this vicinity was undergoing construction as part of a We Energies project, in which the City was not involved. After reviewing the circumstances of this claim, the City Attorney's Office contends

29 that the City is not liable for this damage.

The City is not liable for alleged damages that result from construction projects that the City is notparty to.

We Energies was performing a construction project that required them to dig up the sidewalk near the intersection of Cleveland and Durand Avenues on or about the date in question. The City did not have any concurrent sidewalk construction projects located at or about this intersection on the date in question. As such, the alleged hazard that Ms. Blake tripped upon was not created by the City.

The City Attorney's Office recommends that this Committee deny the claim of Christine Kiernan
because the construction hazard at issue was part of a We Energies construction project, and the City is not
liable for alleged damages that result from construction projects that the City is not party to.
