32	appeals process for a denial of an alcohol beverage or an operator's license changed when the ch. 6		
33	changes were made by the common council earlier this year (specifically, the modification of section 6 23(g) as part of Ordinance No. 13-18 involving growlers). A person whose license application has been

35	recommended to be denied by the public safety and licensing committee may "appeal" by submitting		
36	written arguments to the common council before it meets to make a final decision on the application, as		
37	to whether the person's arrests and conviction record prevents the person from obtaining a license. The		
38	council may also allow the applicant to supplement the written material by oral arguments at the		
39	common council hearing, although no new evidence may be presented at that time. Should this occur, the clerk's office will be in charge of collecting the written arguments from the applicant and dispersing		
40 41	it to the council for review. The council should then use its discretion to determine whether the person		
41	qualifies for a license pursuant to its Policy Guidelines Related to Alcohol Beverages.
