CVMIC presented the City of Racine with an itemized breakdown of the costs that were incurred

30 Medical Payments: \$48,289.46 Expense Payments: \$2,673.70 31 Indemnity Payments: \$19,806.05 32 Total Payments: \$70,769.21 33 34 35 The parties have reached a tentative settlement agreement, pending the approval of the Common Council and the Department of Workforce Development, for a payment of \$50,000.00 in exchange for a 36 release of liability from the City of Kenosha and the Kenosha recruit. Although more than \$70,000 in 37 damages were allegedly incurred, the law imposes a \$50,000 limit on damages arising from tort actions 38 39 against municipalities. If the proposed settlement is rejected, the City could be sued for subrogation, and 40 there would be costs involved in defending the lawsuit. Although this lawsuit would be handled in-house, 41 the costs of litigating this matter would be added to the \$50,000.00 in existing damages, resulting in a greater overall expenditure of the City's limited funds and resources in order to arrive at the same result. 42 43 44 **BUDGETARY IMPACT:** 45 Funding to cover the settlement is available in account 11202-53500, Judgment and Claims. 46 47 **OPTIONS/ALTERNATIVES:** If the recommendation to approve this settlement is rejected, the City could incur additional 48 49 liabilities related to this incident. 50 **RECOMMENDED ACTION:** 51 52 The City Attorney's Office respectfully recommends that the Common Council approve the 53 settlement of this claim. 54 55 **ATTACHMENT(S):** 56
