- Extra staff scheduled for ball diamond prep due to extremely wet conditions.
- Continuation of hiring for all Seasonal Positions; college students should be fully started by mid-June.

#### Forestry Division

 Approximately 47 inventoried trees removed. Several of these trees were hit by cars or vandalized.

- Approximately 78 inventoried trees were pruned as part of our request/off-cycle pruning program.
- Approximately 150 inventoried trees were pruned as part of zone 1 systematic pruning.
- Crews responded to approximately 5 reports of branches down or hanging.
- Crews finished spring tree planting. A total of 846 trees were planted.
