Notification of the Federal Grant may not be until December, 2019. Several alternatives are being investigated including the potential establishment of a Look-A-Like, Satellite, or Hybrid Center. |
| May 2018 through 2019 | Overdose Prevention | Develop a County Understanding / Perspective | Representatives discussed options and opportunities to education, awareness, and prevention activities. PHD is taking a lead role with City of Racine Clinic services and community interactions. |
| May 2018 through 2019 | Drowning Prevention | Develop a County Understanding / Perspective | Representatives discussed options and opportunities to education, awareness, and prevention activities. PHD is taking a lead role with City of Racine Shoreline and efforts to develop programming to bridge the Aquatic Center Activities and open water venues. |
