# <u>Parks</u>

#### Parks Division

- Provided six employees with CDL training. All received their licenses.
- Cleaned debris from high wave action on the Lake Michigan Pathway and grass areas along Pershing Blvd.
- Filled sand play areas in various parks.
- Removed leaves from the Ohio Street medians.
- Completed winter pruning of the roundabouts on Northwestern Ave.
- Picked up piles of cut Burdock left by volunteer groups in Colonial Park.
- Finished leave mulching.
- Assisted the Health Dept. with delivery and spreading of Traffic Bond on paths at Olsen
  Prairie as part of a grant to improve city parks. Other paths will completed by Park Service
  over the winter.
- Removed the fencing from around the tennis courts at Cedar Bend Park.
- Completed a snow removal operation on New Year's Eve.

#### Forestry Division

- Approximately 24 inventoried trees were removed. Additional removal of non-inventoried trees located in natural park areas also occurred.
- Crews responded to one report of a branch down or hanging.
- Approximately 15 inventoried trees were pruned as part of our request/off-cycle pruning program. Approximately 1,090 trees were pruned as part of this program in 2019.
- Approximately 310 inventoried trees were pruned as part of the zone 1 systematic pruning program. Approximately 1,850 trees were pruned as part of this program in 2019. Zone 1 pruning will continue in January with a goal of finishing by the end of the month.
- Numerous meadows, prairies and no-mow zones were mowed in December including but not limited to Johnson Park, Wustum Museum, Johnson Preserve, Island Park, Lincoln Park, and Cedar Bend Park.
