

**Thereas:** Children's Mental Health Awareness Day is observed each year to raise awareness about the importance of children's mental health and the significant role mental health plays in overall health and wellness; and

*Whereas:* Addressing the complex mental health needs for youth and families today is fundamental to the future of our community; and

*Whereas:* One of five Racine area children have a diagnosable mental health issue and suicide is the leading cause of death for Racine youth between the ages of ten and 24; and

*Whereas:* 53% of Racine youth have reported having a significant issue with anxiety, 36% of Racine youth report feeling sad or hopeless for more than two weeks in a row, and 20% of Racine youth have seriously considered suicide; and

*Whereas:* Racine is one of ten communities across Wisconsin funded by the *Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin Endowment* which is focused on improving the social and emotional health of students; and

*Whereas:* Mental health stigma needs to be addressed to have open conversations about mental health and how we can compassionately respond and support our community's youth; and

*Whereas:* The importance of talking about mental health within our Racine families, schools, and community is critically important.
