*Whereas:* all those who wear a badge report for duty with an understanding of the risks and sacrifices they may be called upon to make as they work to enforce laws to keep our community safe; and

*Whereas:* on Peace Officers Memorial Day we remember the selfless dedication and bravery of peace officers who, through their courageous deeds and loyal devotion to their oath, have lost their lives or have become disabled in the performance of duty; and

*Whereas:* we especially remember Officer John D. Hetland, a decorated veteran member of the Racine Police Department, who served with distinction for over 24 years and who on June 17, 2019, gave his all, making the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty while protecting the lives of the residents of Racine; and

*Whereas:* Officer Hetland will be further honored and remembered as his name is added to the Racine County Law Enforcement Memorial on May 11, 2021.

**Now Therefore:** I, Cory Mason, the Mayor of Racine Wisconsin, do hereby call upon all residents to observe May 15, 2021, as

and to lower flags to half-staff as directed under Presidential Order in honor of law enforcement personnel who have given their lives in service, and to recognize and pay respect to the survivors of those fallen heroes.
