 - We are proud to partner with Professional Services Group to offer 2 new programs; Life Skills for youth and Strengthening Families on Thursday afternoons.
- The playground program has made a strong comeback from last year's Covid-19 numbers and they are averaging about 20-25 youth per day
- The first Hot Summer Nights concert is July 1st featuring Groove Line

<u>Tyler</u> – Domer

- Playground orientation was June 14 18 and we started with kids on June 21. We have 3 parks hosting playgrounds. Lockwood has KK, future, play it again and Bigs, 8 leaders with approximately 180 kids, Humble has Future, PIA and BIGS with 6 leaders and approximately 80 kids and Pierce Woods has Kiddie Korner with 2 leaders and approximately 15 kids.
- We also host a traditional site at Tyler-Domer and offer free lunches Monday thru Thursday from 11:00 am until 1:00 pm.
- Basketball practices are coming back slowly
- Pickle ball, weight lifters, and ping pong are back
- High school sports has been completed and travel teams are using Horlick Field as well as the Raiders for football
