- Storm/wind damage: crews removed down or hanging branches at 219 known locations. An estimated 10-20 trees were removed or placed on a removal list as a direct result of storm/wind damage.
- Forestry mower: the forestry mower and boom flail have been active in multiple park locations with the goal of clearing undesirable woody species as part of the process to restore desired plant species.
