RESOLUTION BY THE RACINE COUNTY SPECIAL COMMITTEE REGARDING REAPPORTIONMENT MAINTAINING THE NUMBER OF SUPERVISORY DISTRICTS AT 21

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

WHEREAS, every ten years, following the completion of the United States Federal Census, it is the responsibility of the Racine County Board to work with the municipalities of Racine County to redraw district and ward lines in accordance with federal and state laws; and

WHEREAS, as part of that process, the Racine County Board Chairman appointed the Special Committee Regarding Reapportionment; and

WHEREAS, the Committee's duties include considering and determining the appropriate number of supervisory districts to ensure effective and efficient representation for all citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the number of supervisory districts for the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the number of Supervisors shall remain at 21; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee Regarding Reapportionment shall create 21 Supervisory districts as part of the redistricting plan based on the 2020 decennial census and present that plan, as statutorily required, at appropriate public hearings and to the Racine County Board of Supervisors for approval.

WHEREAS, the Special Committee Regarding Reapportionment reviewed and considered the final estimate of the January 1, 2020 population for Racine County, which was provided by the Demographic Services Center to the Racine County Clerk's Office, and estimates a change of 0.18% since the 2010 census; and

WHEREAS, the Special Committee Regarding Reapportionment discussed and considered previous decreases in the number of supervisory districts, which occurred as part of the redistricting process, and determined that the current number of supervisory districts supports the County Board Committee structure and effective and efficient representation of citizens through constituent size; and

WHEREAS, after consideration and discussion, the Special Committee Regarding Reapportionment has determined that the Racine County Board appropriately remains at 21 supervisory districts through the redistricting process based on the 2020 decennial census.
