Subject: (Direct Referral) Communication from Patrick F. Culpepper requesting an exemption from the residency restrictions that would allow him to reside at 617 Wisconsin Avenue Apartment 5.

Exemption Granted.

Sean Brown disclosed his current employment with the Racine County DA and his prior employment with the State Public Defenders office, and personal contact with Mr. Culpepper's attorney as a potential conflict of interest. Mr. Culpepper waived any potential conflict.

The Board members interviewed Mr. Culpepper.

Sean Brown moved that the Sex Offender Residency Restriction Board convene in closed session pursuant to Section 19.85(1)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes to deliberate concerning the quasi-judicial hearing regarding appeal of Patrick F. Culpepper for an exemption to the residency restrictions that would allow him to reside at 617 Wisconsin Avenue Apartment 5, and that the Board will convene in open session to announce its decision. Sean Brown moved to go into Open Session. Roll Call Vote: David Younk Aye; Jessica Diaz Aye; Sean Brown Aye.

Sean Brown delivered the decision to grant the exemption, noting how quickly Mr. Culpepper was able to obtain employment and that he will still be under DOC supervision for an appreciable amount of time. Mr. Culpepper was cautioned that he may have to return to the Board for another exemption if he decides to move to another residence in the future.
